Guidance

Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Those from the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds will be among those hardest hit. The aggregate impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response must match the scale of the challenge.

Schools' allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil from Y3 to Year 6.

As the catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available for the 2021 to 2022 academic year. It will not be added to schools' baselines in calculating future years' funding allocations.

Key Priority:

To effectively deploy catch up premium resources to recover learning lost during the pandemic by:

- High Quality Teaching: supporting teachers in their delivery of high quality teaching for all pupils.
- Targeted Support: identifying pupils including disadvantaged pupils and pupils with Special Educational Needs most in need of intervention.
- Wider Strategies: providing mental health and wellbeing support to identified pupils and families.
