Please ensure that you top up your accounts for the week ahead to avoid a build up of outstanding monies. As stated on our website, if your child has an outstanding dinner debt, they must bring a packed lunch until the debt is cleared. If you are struggling or need support from school, please email the school office.

## Holidays during term time

The school cannot authorise an absence for a holiday during term time . Taking holidays during term times means that pupils miss important school time, both educationally and for other school activities. Children often find it difficult to catch up with school work when they return.

You may be issued with a Education Penalty Notice if you take your child on holiday during term time without authorisation from the school.

The Authority issues Education Penalty Notices by post. Payment of an Education Penalty Notice is  $\pm 60$  if paid within 21 days, rising to  $\pm 120$  if paid after this time, but within 28 days. Education Penalty Notices are issued separately to each parent in respect of each child. A possible exception to this would be where parents are separated, and one parent has taken a child on unauthorised leave of absence without the knowledge / consent of the other parent.
