#Wake Up Wednesday

Snack time

Please be reminded that we are a Healthy Eating and Nut-Free school! Snacks for breaktime should be fruit, toast or other sugar-free products. Please be reminded that grapes MUST be cut in half as they are a choking hazard, The size and shape of grapes means they can completely plug a child's airway. The tight seal produced by the grape's smooth surface makes them difficult to dislodge with standard first aid techniques. The Child Accident Prevention Trust advises that grapes should be chopped in half lengthways and ideally in quarters.


