#Wake Up Wednesday

Around 35 million X users are under 18! So it's essential that parents and carers stay up to date with the changes made to Twitter since its reinvention as X – and the online safety hazards these alterations might pose, including exposure to explicit content and unpleasant behaviour!

That's not to say, however, that X is a ruined platform: a more cautious approach can still enable young people to navigate it comparatively safely. This week's **#WakeUpWednesday** guide suggests some steps that can help children avoid common pitfalls – both new *and* old – on X. Please see guide attached.
